

## ADDITIONAL CURATIVE CONNECTIONS SERVICES

### Adult Day Services *(State certified)*

Fun and supportive place for seniors and people with disabilities, including people who may be frail, have dementia, or simply need supervision during the day.

### Brain Rehabilitation & Wellness Program

Comprehensive day program for adults who have experienced a traumatic or acquired brain injury or other neurological impairment.

### Specialized Learning Programs

**Literacy:** Educational program to help increase everyday independence in preparation for work in the community; includes academic and computer skills, GED preparation, etc.

**Ready, Set, Life!** Interactive group experience designed to build independent living skills using both community and classroom locations.

**Mind Movers:** Classroom program to promote brain health for those experiencing signs of early memory loss.

### Home & Community Services

**Supportive home care:** Home and daily living skills services that help seniors and adults with disabilities in their own homes or in the community.

**Teaching & training:** Family and individual support training offered to youth, adults, or entire families to help with communication, interpersonal skills, problem-solving, parenting support, and decision-making.

### AT Home with Dementia — Assistive

**Technology Support:** In-home assessments and recommendations to individuals with dementia on helpful memory loss gadgets, devices and/or technology that will help support people with dementia and their caregivers.

### Employment & Training Services

Variety of job preparation services, including classroom and on-the-job training, skill, development, and hands-on work experience to help participants prepare for community employment.

## WHAT ARE SPECIALIZED TRANSPORTATION SERVICES?

Curative Connections provides a door-to-door transportation service within Brown County to adults 60 years and older and people with disabilities, allowing them to lead a more fulfilling, self-sufficient lifestyle. Rides are provided to doctor appointments, jobs, grocery stores, social outings, and more. A large vehicle fleet includes cars and accessible vans/buses to accommodate various mobility levels. The program is staffed primarily by volunteers, which enables Curative Connections to offer rides at an affordable rate.

### Benefits

- ✓ Credible and long-standing service offered for over 50 years (previously operated by the American Red Cross)
- ✓ Rides provided to a variety of destinations
- ✓ Door-to-door drop off and pickup service; drivers assist riders to and from front door of their residence and destination
- ✓ Low-cost rides (\$3 per one-way trip)
- ✓ Trained, insured, and caring drivers
- ✓ Ability for personal care attendants and companions to accompany client
- ✓ Friendly office and dispatch staff for scheduling appointments

### Areas Served

Rides are limited to residents of Brown County. Type of ride service may differ by geographic area and will be dependent on volunteer availability. If your town is not listed, call 920-227-4272 for information.

## HOW DO YOU GET STARTED WITH TRANSPORTATION SERVICES?

**Eligibility:** Adults 60 years and older and people with disabilities.

**Service Fee:** \$3 per one-way trip. Waivers for reduced or free rides may be available upon request. Five-ride and ten-ride tickets available.

**Hours of Operation:** Monday through Friday, 8 am to 4:30 pm. Pickups available at 7:30 am for medical appointments (based on driver availability)

### Additional Information:

- **Trips:** All trips are scheduled on a first come, first served basis. Medical appointments take precedence over other trips. Trips may be shared with other clients. For rural areas, schedule or services may vary.
- **Waiting time:** Clients are asked to be ready and waiting for driver 15 minutes in advance of scheduled pickup.
- **Client assistance:** Drivers will provide door-to-door assistance and help client (as needed) from the front door of their residence to the front door of their destination. Drivers are not permitted to lift or transfer clients. Wheelchair assisted vans are available and must be requested when scheduling an appointment. Clients can be accompanied by personal care attendants.
- **Client rules:** State law requires that ALL drivers and riders MUST wear a seatbelt. No smoking, no opened food or drink containers allowed in vehicles.
- **Carry ons:** Portable oxygen tanks are permitted on vehicles. Clients are allowed up to 5 bags of groceries weighing no more than 15 pounds in total.
